





Question: The Star Tetrahedron was thought to represent what basic element of the world?

(Move one step, counter-clockwise)

Answer: The Star Tetrahedron symbolizes the element of **Fire**. Made of two tetrahedrons (triangular pyramids), the Star Tetrahedron is a sharp figure that corresponds with the sharp and piercing heat of the fire. Its uniform shape also makes it symbolic of harmony, equilibrium, stability, and balance.

Question: How many vertices, faces and edges does the Star Tetrahedron have?

(Move one step, counter-clockwise)

Answer: 8 vertices (4 for each Tetrahedron); 8 triangular faces (4 for each Tetrahedron); 12 interlocking edges, (6 for each tetrahedron).
