Caring for your pet rock.

You should feed your rock two solid meals a day and provide a bowl of water to keep it in peak condition.

Training

Origami rocks are intelligent animals and are capable of learning a range of tricks.

To teach your origami rock to stay, first place it on the ground and give the command "stay". If this works you reward your rock with a treat and if it doesn't work the first time try again.

To teach your origami rock to sit place it on the ground and say "sit". This can be used with the "stay" command to keep your pet rock in the same place for a long time.

If you really want to impress people then you should teach your rock to play dead. First place your pet rock on the ground and form a gun shape with your hand. Then aim at your pet rock and make "pew" noises. Your rock should then fall down and play dead.
